Dear Church Family,



After lots of years of writing this front cover of *Second Press*, which I have used to share important news, offer faithful nourishment, encourage your reflections and discipleship, I come to this final column.

First, though I hope you will hear me say this again and often in more personal ways in the

coming weeks, please know my deep gratitude to you, to this vibrant church family. It has been among the highest honors of my life to serve as your Pastor and to journey with you in worship, faith, and life across the past years. As the Apostle Paul says, *"I thank my God every time I remember you, constantly praying with joy in every one of my prayers..."* (Philippians 1:3-4) You have inspired my faith, deepened my trust in God, and shown me courage and devotion in God's work. I will never forget our time in ministry and striving to love and serve God. Ginger and I convey our deepest and sincere thanks to you, and to God's goodness and grace for linking us in life and ministry.

Second, many of you have asked about emerging plans for the church in the coming months. As you might know, this approaching transition period to find a new Pastor takes time, energy, prayers, and care at many levels. Here are some of the steps:

- My last Sunday with you as Pastor will be April 30. We look forward to a joyful celebration of our common life and ministry together.
- May 7 the Presbytery of the James requests a visit during Sunday worship; one of the new leaders of Presbytery will preach in worship and lead the service along with Kate, Hannah, Kelley, and other familiar faces.
- The Personnel Council, led by Jon Heckel, has a team in place working hard to find short-term leadership for the coming months. We are fortunate to have some people ready and willing to step up in some focused ways, like pastoral care and administration.

Roger Gench and Mary Jane Winter will assume some additional duties to help maintain the health and vitality of the church and in support of Kate and other staff members. This group is exploring other people and possibilities too. The Session will convey more details soon about these decisions. Stay tuned.

 As soon as possible, the church will pursue several important steps: a) take this interim season to do some intentional mission studies and evaluations; b) request the Presbytery Committee on Ministry for permission to elect a Pastor Nominating Committee, which is elected at a Congregational Meeting which will be called when approved; and c) do all things to facilitate and expedite the above process toward the election of a new Pastor.

While these things take time, a primary goal of the Session, the Personnel Council, and all involved in this process is to move through this next season expeditiously, with care, for the health and vitality of the church.

As this church moves through this process and toward a bright future worshipping and serving God, you have my deep affection, prayers, and care. I step away full of gratitude, trusting in God's goodness, and confident about the leadership and membership of this great gathering of God's people.

I hope for a great month of April together, in worship and service, with ample opportunities to connect with you and rejoice in God's grace so much in our midst.

May God bless us and keep us all.

They will continue in their dynamic and interactive studies of the gospel text for the week in Sunday school.


Youth Sunday, April 16!

A New Exhibit ~ Anything But Ordinary

Calling all artists! Are you a writer, an artist, an illustrator? Are you a poet, photographer? Do you create three-dimensional works?

Our theme for this Ordinary Time art show ("ordinary time" is the liturgical season after Pentecost, and before Advent) is *Anything But Ordinary*. This show will features art work from the congregation and will be hung and installed in the **Second Pres Gallery** (which is the hallway that

you walk through as you enter from the parking deck).

As you consider what to contribute to the show, think about this: Where, in your art and artwork, are you most aware of the stunning beauty embedded in our ordinary lives and surroundings? How does God's ever presence emerge in your piece? We know that the minutiae of the everyday can feel mundane at times, but the many details of life can also hold beauty, comfort, and rhythm. Perhaps you have works from artistic practices that sustained you through the pandemic years. Perhaps you have experienced a connection with God in the creative process itself.

Pick up a submission form (available on the gallery hall table, or use the PDF link here (<u>.pdf linked here</u>) to attach to the back of your framed/mounted submission. On this form we would like you to include a brief artist's statement/meditation on your work, and how it relates to the theme of *Anything But Ordinary*. (Maximum of three works per artist, please.) Submit artwork by April 30; bring to The Studio, located on the third floor (Suite 301 Conference Room). Lean your works on wall left of the door.


Day Book Group Wednesday, April 19 at 10:00 am
