I love the fact that we begin worship every Sunday by pouring water into our baptismal font and remember our baptism, for baptism can significantly orient us in this transitional period. Indeed, this practice can be a map for us that can direct our journey together in this critical period in the church's life. Over the years, I've learned a great deal about baptism from theologian Gordon Lathrop.

In his book, *Holy Ground: A Liturgical Cosmology*, Lathrop observes that in Mark's gospel, when Jesus emerges from the waters of his baptism (1:10-11), something happens that remaps the world, that entails nothing short of what Lathrop calls a remapping of the cosmos. For Mark tells us that as he came up out of the water, he saw the heavens being "ripped apart" and the Spirit descending like a dove upon him—identifying and empowering Jesus as one who maps the very trajectory of God in the world and as one in whom God is decisively at work to reclaim and restore God's good creation.

It is important to note that the heavens do not simply "open," for something that opens can close. Mark tells us that the heavens were ripped apart—that reality was irreparably altered as a fissure in the heavens appeared—a permanent elimination of the boundary between heaven and earth. Gordon Lathrop speaks of it as the hole in the cosmic map of the universe.

And as Jesus' baptism prefigures our own baptism, it is this hole in the map of the universe that orients our lives. This means that for us at Second Presbyterian, the center of our life together is not so much a neighborhood or a geographical location like the capital, or a political or financial center. The center of the Second Presbyterian map is the baptismal font, over which there is a symbolic hole in the heavens. This is where we hear a voice that tells us the truth about ourselves, claiming us as God's own beloved children, and where God's own Spirit claims us and anoints us for service. The hole in the cosmic map of the universe also means that God is on the loose in this world in Jesus' ministry and in our own discipleship to him. God's transforming power is on the loose in this world, challenging everything that distorts and disfigures human life and God's good creation, and empowering us to lend our energies to God's project of healing what is broken.

The coming months will be anything but ordinary. We will be discerning what God has in mind for us through the guidance of the Session, the Staff and Interim Team, the Presbytery of the James, the Presbyterian Church (USA) call system.

But let us not forget that our basic orientation—our map—for the time ahead is our baptism font over which there a symbolic hole in the heavens that reminds us that God has called us and is forming us to be the body of Christ on this corner of RVA and the world. Thanks be to God.

Transition Information at Second Pres

Presbyterians believe that God uses committees, papers, procedures, and our polity—sprinkled with a generous measure of prayer, Scripture, and worship—to help a church family discern who it is that God is calling to be their pastor. The transition season takes time to build relationships with candidates to discern who will be called. This call is confirmed as the pastor, the church, and the presbytery each say "yes" to the relationship. This three-way partnership is acted out throughout the pastoral call process.

Roles of the Congregation during the transition:

- Continuing to support the ministry of the church through prayer, participation, and financial support during the time of pastoral transition
- Participate in the Mission Study this summer, through Holy Cow! Consulting
- Electing the Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC)
- Praying regularly for the PNC
- Electing the new pastor and approving the terms of call
- Welcoming the new pastor as the ministry begins

Transition Team of Three at Second:

- **Roger Gench**: summer 2023- acting head-of-staff, moderator of Session and leading staff meetings; starting in the fall of 2023, focus on worship & teaching
- Mary Jane Winter: pastoral care & worship
- Fred Holbrook: starting September 2023- head-of-staff, administration, moderating Session, leading staff meetings, and worship

All three pastors are familiar with Second Church, and are eager to support the congregation's move through the transition season with grace, confidence, and clarity.

Lori Lape will host (1905 Westover Hills Blvd) and lead the discussion of *The Lions of Fifth Avenue* by Fiona Davis.


