Dear Church Family,

We are entering a season of change and transition together. God has sent faithful leaders to serve at Second since its founding, and we trust that the right person will follow the Spirit's guidance to join us for the next chapter of life and ministry together.

The scriptures remind us, "For everything there is a season and a time for every matter under heaven" (Ecclesiastes 3:1). As we navigate this season together, we strive to keep being a vibrant congregation, focused on excellent worship and mission in downtown Richmond.

Thank you for your patience as the Transition Team, led by Jon Heckel, has worked to discern the right leadership for the interim season. At the April meeting, the Session unanimously approved a resolution from the Transition Team. This resolution outlined a team approach for the transitional leadership of the congregation, with Roger Gench, Mary Jane Winter, and Fred Holbrook.

- Roger Gench will be the "bridge interim," leading the team over the summer months. He will preach with a similar frequency as Alex, two to three times a month, and he will lead staff meetings and will moderate the Session. Starting in mid-September, Roger will shift into a quarter-time role, focusing on preaching once a month and teaching Adult Education classes.
- Mary Jane Winter will join the team on a quarter-time basis, focusing on pastoral care, mission, and worship.
- In mid-September, **Fred Holbrook** will join the Interim Team as the cornerstone. Fred will work half-time, focusing on administration, guiding the transition with the church and the Commission on Ministry of the POJ, and preaching an average of twice a month. Fred brings experience as a transitional pastor in churches in Lynchburg, Virginia, and Overland Park, Kansas, and he served as the interim general presbyter and stated clerk for the Presbytery of the James for three and a half years. He will lead First Presbyterian, Charlottesville, this summer, while their head of staff is away on sabbatical, and then he will join the Interim Team at Second.

We are fortunate to have three experienced pastors, who are familiar with Second church, all working from their strengths! One goal of this Interim Team is to guide Second in navigating this season in an expeditious and intentional manner. We do not want to slow down the work of the Holy Spirit.

I am delighted that all three pastors have agreed to join the team in leading Second through this season. My call to serve as your Associate Pastor is such a joy; I hope to "stay in my lane" as much as possible, ready to serve with the Interim Team and then to welcome the new pastor.

The process in calling a new pastor is complex in the PC(USA). Join me on Sunday mornings in the dining room in May, as I offer an overview of the call process and highlight how we are called to prepare to welcome new leadership. The Interim Team, church staff, and I invite your questions and prayers along the way, as we seek to follow Christ's call to be the church during this next chapter.

I hope you, too, will find some inspiration for this interim season from the late Irish priest-poet-philosopher John O'Donohue:

"As far as you can, hold your confidence...

What is being transfigured here is your mind, And it is difficult and slow to become new. The more faithfully you can endure here, The more refined your heart will become For your arrival in the new dawn."
